For Geoff, time spent at Resthaven allows his wife a chance to get on with her things at home, which keeps her happy too.

"We get some help at home from Resthaven with general household tasks and physiotherapy, and it's nice to have this social support outside of the home as well," Geoff says.

Andrea says, "We welcome Commonwealth Home Support Program clients living in Gawler, Barossa and surrounds. We do, however, encourage any older people to join if they would like to—the more the merrier!"

In addition to the clubs and groups offered by Resthaven Northern Community Services, the Gawler team holds monthly bus trips for clients in the area, where they can enjoy a meal at the local pub or café.
