In the wake of **BARNABY JOYCE'S** stumbumbling fall from grace there have been MPs admitting to drinking on the job, and a lot of tut-tutting about alcohol being available in the Parliament House workplace. It rang a bell, and took a bit of digging, but I found this front page of the defunct Sydney Daily Mirror from the early 1990s, when South Australia's own then-senator **AMANDA** 

VANSTONE reportedly suggested drug testing all MPs. Like many great ideas such as MPs having to serve their full term or pay for the subsequent by-election, self-interest won and nothing happened. Thirty years on, Prime Minister ANTHONY ALBANESE rejected the idea of random alcohol testing in parliament, saying – apparently seriously: "I don't want to see us be in a position where we say we are unable to act like adults."

# RETIREMENT PROTECTION

Good to see the state government moving amendments to the Retirement Villages Act for more protection for residents. There are some 26,700 residents in 520 retirement villages in SA. Amendments include reducing the statutory buyback period from 18 months to 12 months so vacating families receive their exit entitlements sooner; capping

increases on charges to the inflation rate; and capping the amount a resident or their family pay for capital maintenance when they leave to 12.5 per cent. This is a massive growth sector, with a predicted shortfall of 49,000 retirement dwellings by 2040 as the current cohort of 2 million people aged over 75 soars to 3.4 million.
