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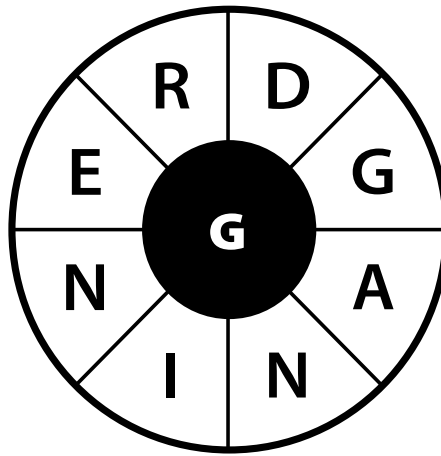

From the CEO

I hope that you have had a wonderful start to 2024 and enjoyed the festive period with your families and friends.

A year of great promise

After several years of significant reform and change, we are beginning to see the benefits of this hard work.

This year will see the introduction of a new rights-based Aged Care Act, together with revised Aged Care Quality Standards. The release of the Aged Care Taskforce Report is also imminent and we are hopeful that it will address some of the shortcomings of the current funding system.

We have a lot to celebrate this year; the first Resthaven Excellence Awards, the completion of the stunning Resthaven Bellevue Heights redevelopment, the conclusion of the transformative 'Ignite' project, along with many other highlights.

There is a lot to look forward to.

Looking to the Future

In 2024 we will begin development of Resthaven's 2025-2030 Strategic Plan which will be released in time for our 90th birthday in 2025. The Board held a workshop in February to commence this review.

Aged Care Standards

In December 2023, the final draft of the strengthened Aged Care Quality Standards were released.

They incorporate feedback from wide consultation and the results of the pilot program. They also bring the Standards into line with the proposed New Aged Care Act. It is proposed that they will commence from 1 July 2024.

The older person is at the centre of the Strengthened Standards, with the required actions and themes of Standard 1 (Consumer Dignity and Choice) flowing through to all other Standards. This results in a more detailed focus on delivering service that is structured around the needs, preferences and choices of each person.

From the CEO (continued)

Language throughout the Standards includes changed terminology from 'consumer' to 'older person,' demonstrating that people in aged care should be considered active partners in their own care rather than being a recipient of a service.

International Collaboration

Resthaven has had a long-standing relationship with Baan Sudthavas Foundation. Since the director, Arnop Chirakiti first approached Resthaven in 2012 to provide mentorship and support for his philanthropic gesture of building a residential care home for elderly women in Thailand.

On 6 December 2023, Baan Sudthavas held an event to celebrate their 10th anniversary. Guests included people and organisations that have assisted the organisation, including Silom Complex staff, volunteers, two local hospitals, students and staff from nearby university and authorities.

As part of the celebration, staff and volunteers held up a banner with the Resthaven logo, with the words 'wish you were here' (top), to acknowledge Resthaven's support over the past ten years. Arnop sent an email together with several photographs.

Resthaven sent a letter of congratulations, together with a return 'thank you' photo, and a small gift as a token of our friendship.

Clinical Governance and Quality Committee

Ms Angela Coker has been appointed to the Resthaven Board Clinical Governance and Quality Committee as the Consumer Advocate.

Community Services & Retirement Living

Movements in the Murraylands

With the recent acquisition of additional services within Resthaven Murray Bridge, Hills & Fleurieu Community Services, it has become a sizable service across five offices, covering a very large geographical area.

Tanya Boakes and the team have done an amazing job supporting the staff and the clients with the expansion, however, this is not sustainable moving forward. To ensure we can continue to grow and support the needs of our direct service teams and clients, a decision has been made to divide the region into two sites: Resthaven Fleurieu Community Services, and Resthaven Murray Mallee Hills Community Services.

I am delighted to report that Tanya Boakes (below left) has been appointed as the new Manager in the Fleurieu, and Kimberley Lord (right) as the new Manager for Murray Mallee Hills.



Both Tanya and Kimberley are well known within the region, and have proven themselves over recent months with the changes that have occurred with the increase of service provision.

The aim is to have the region completely divided with all the reporting, systems and processes in place ready for the new financial year on 1 July 2024. While there will be a separation undertaken, both regions will continue to work closely together to deliver outstanding care and support to older people.



Property Moves

We are undertaking a number of property moves.

During December 2023, the Agedcare Alternatives team relocated from the site on Fullarton Road to 237 Glen Osmond Road, where the Project Ignite team have previously been located. We closed the Fullarton Road site at the end of January 2024, after occupation for 13 years. Thank you to the Volunteer Options Guides for relocating to Glen Osmond Road, Frewville.

We will also relocate our team from Manningham to our new site on Main North Road, Sefton Park, shortly.

We have relocated the Resthaven Limestone Coast Community Services Mount Gambier team to new premises in the Mount, at 13 Penola Road.

With the end of the lease, the Resthaven Western Community Services respite services at Regency Cottage will soon relocate to the main site at 96 Woodville Road, Woodville.

Retirement Living

We have received development approval for the expansion of Chiton Retirement Living (above) to build 11 new villas, a community garden, and caravan park. This will be an exciting project working to sell these off the plan.

We have had a busy few months, with a number of units across the portfolio coming back to sell, and new residents moving in. The team has been wonderful helping myself and Retirement Living Operations Manager, Matt Cragg, come up to speed with the retirement world within Resthaven.

We look forward to engaging volunteers for visiting clients at home (read more about this on page 9). We are moving into an exciting new era in Community Services and Retirement Living. Let's have an amazing year!

Building Updates

We have a packed year in 2024. We continue to develop new locations and refurbish existing ones, with many projects in construction or planning stages.

Resthaven Bellevue Heights

Stage 2 of the redevelopment of Resthaven Bellevue Heights, incorporating 23 new rooms, is progressing onsite. Handover is expected in June 2024.

The refurbishment of Acacia is in its final stage, which will complete all internal rooms. The finished lounge area in Acacia is pictured below.



Resthaven Westbourne Park

The major redevelopment of Resthaven Westbourne Park is progressing well, with the new areas to be handed over in March 2024.

The final stage of the refurbishment of Marlborough is underway, and will be complete in March.

Stage 1 will include the construction of 42 new rooms, to replace old rooms in Hampton and Richmond. Stage 2 commenced in February.

Resthaven Chiton Retirement Living

The development application at Resthaven Chiton Retirement Living has been approved by Alexandrina Council. It includes 11 additional retirement units, a garden reserve, and caravan park.



The 11 units will complete the village and complement the existing units.

We are in the process of completing the design and engaging contractors. We expect that the works will commence in the third quarter of 2024.

Resthaven Marion Campus

The Resthaven Marion campus is a major centre for our services in the area, providing residential aged care, retirement living, community services, and community respite. A scheme is now being developed for this campus, in consultation with all services on site. The lodgement of the development application is planned for this year. A planning meeting was held in February (pictured above).

Resthaven Paradise & Eastern Community Services

Fit out works are nearing completion on the new Resthaven Paradise & Eastern Community Services premises at 255 Main North Road, Sefton Park. The premises is a former ANZ branch and is very prominent on the junction of Main North Road and Regency Road.

Unfortunately, occupation was delayed by a rather brazen break-in, where the copper pipework

was cut out and stolen from an air conditioning unit. It is expected the former Manningham service will be operational in the new premises in mid 2024.

Rooftop Solar PV Project

The first installation of rooftop solar panels took place at Resthaven Paradise in late 2023, and is now operational.

Installations at Resthaven Aberfoyle Park, Port Elliot and Mount Gambier are underway.

The installations across corporate and community services offices are all complete.

Over 240kw have so far been brought online. The estimated reduction in our carbon footprint is estimated at 9%. This is a great step forward, and something for us all to be proud of.

A client of Resthaven Riverland Community Services, Betty was a Deaconess of the Uniting Church, working in the Women's Welfare Department at the Kate Cocks Memorial Babies Home at Brighton from 1969 to 1975.

In 1975, after her dad passed away, Betty returned to Waikerie to care for her mother, and she found her place within the local church once more. She took on some local preaching roles, taught the Sunday School, and led a Group Bible Study.

Even when she retired, Betty continued to spend two days a week at the hospital day care centre where she helped with craft work. She did this for around 30 years, and it was only a global pandemic that could slow her down.

'The church has really given me a wonderful life,' Betty says. Happy Birthday Betty!

Health & Safety

Manual Handling

Manual handling is any form of lifting and carrying, including using force to push, pull or hold something.



We all engage in 'manual handling' every day. It includes when we pick up a ball, clean the bath, go shopping, sit at a desk, and hundreds of other daily tasks.

Before you undertake a manual handling task, ask yourself:

- How heavy are the items you have to move?
- How far does the load need to be carried?
- How much bending and twisting will there be?
- How repetitive will the task be?
- Does the job need two people, or the use of trolleys?

Tips on how to bend, lift and carry safely:

- Keep feet shoulder width apart
- Bend at the knees (not waist) and stick out your bottom
- Keep the load small and close to your body (arms/elbows in)
- Coordinate with the person helping you
- Avoid twisting your body; move your feet first.

Remember:

- Only carry as much as feels comfortable for you
- Maintain spinal curves and good posture
- The squat position is best when you need to bend low
- Utilise equipment (ie trolleys)
- Ensure you have adequate space, lighting, and work at surface height
- Do not stand on tables, chairs or ladders to reach heights
- Don't rush
- Take regular breaks (including from sitting).

Helping People

We do not require volunteers to lift or transfer residents or clients. This includes taking the part weight of people, for example, taking someone by the arm, or helping someone out of a chair. This is the responsibility of direct care staff, including nurses and personal care assistants, who have been trained to use specific lifting techniques and equipment.

Avoid the temptation to help people out of a chair. This can inhibit a client/resident's ability to maintain their mobility and independence, and you are at risk if the person loses balance. You will not be able to hold them, so two people may potentially be injured. Your best intentions to help could create risk to you and the client/resident.

If a client/resident requires assistance, seek care staff.

2024 Influenza Vaccinations Update

The new influenza season will be upon us soon. Staff and volunteers are strongly encouraged to obtain a flu vaccine between March and June 2024. There are three main ways to obtain your flu vaccine:

1. Through your GP (free of charge for those 65 years and over)
2. Through your local pharmacy (cost may be reimbursed by Resthaven)
3. Through your local Resthaven site (Keep an eye out for site notices and ask Reception regarding timing—site notices will include information for making online vaccination appointments).

We are very happy to reimburse flu vaccine costs. We will require a copy of your receipt, and your bank details, for reimbursement of cost. This can be provided to Volunteer Services via the above contact details when you send through your copy of the vaccination record.
